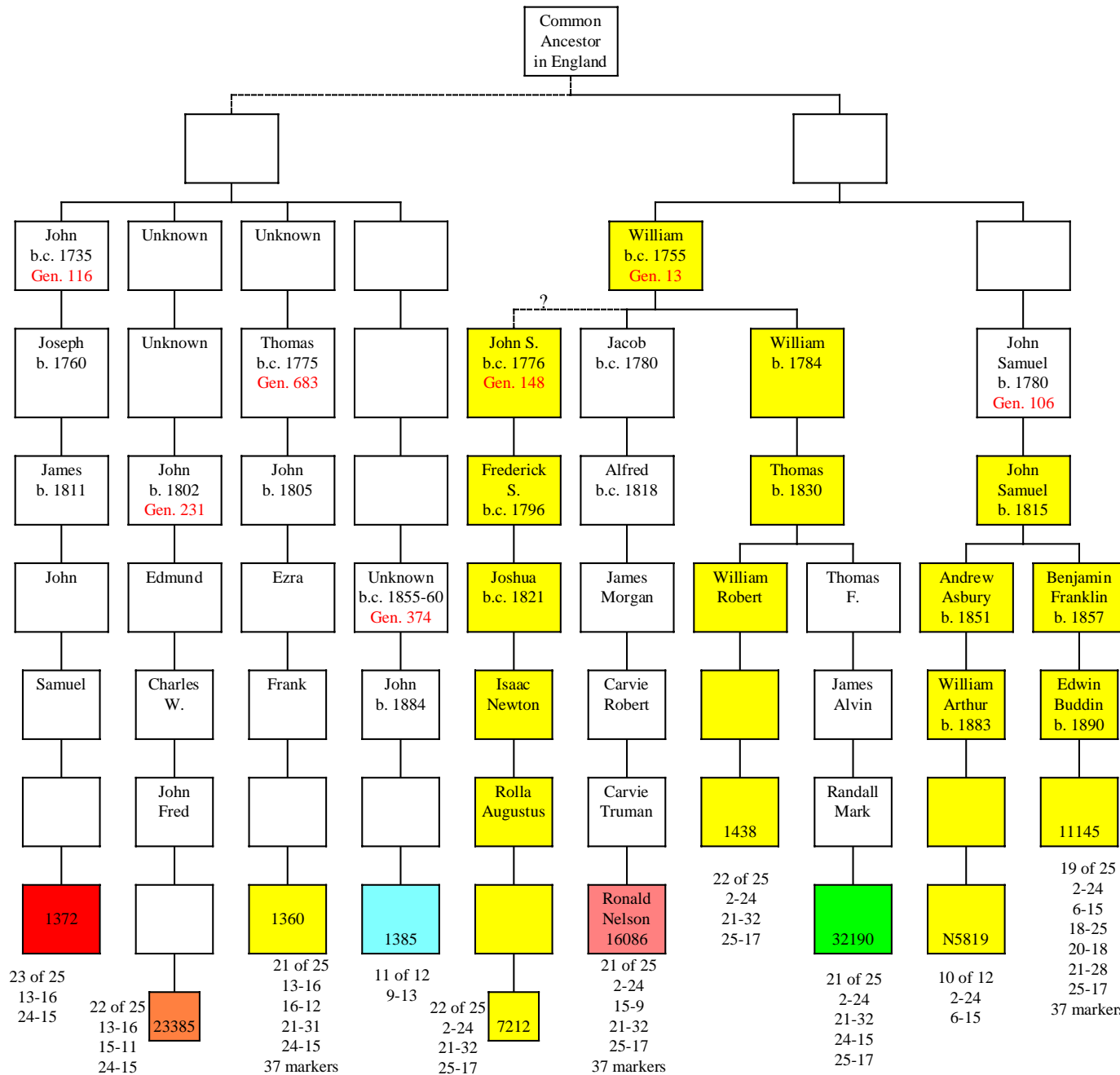


Graves Families of Cambridgeshire and Lancashire, England

NOTES: This chart shows male lines of descent only, since the focus is on using Y-DNA analysis to trace the Graves surname.
 The number in each bottom colored box is the DNA test ID.
 When two descendants of a common ancestor have exactly the same DNA test results, it is assumed that the common ancestor also had that result, and all boxes up to and including the common ancestor have been given the same color.
 24 of 25 means that 24 of the 25 markers matched the inferred ancestral haplotype.
 A notation like 13-19 indicates a mutation from the ancestral haplotype, and means marker 13 had a value of 19.
 The ancestral haplotype used for this chart was estimated from the existing DNA results. After testing of additional descendants and further research, the determination of the haplotype will probably improve.
 All boxes with the same color usually have the same DNA test results. However, that may not be quite true on this chart.
 The exact connections between the various families shown on this chart are based on conjecture until proof is obtained by documentation. The relationships shown on this chart are intended largely as a guide to further research.
