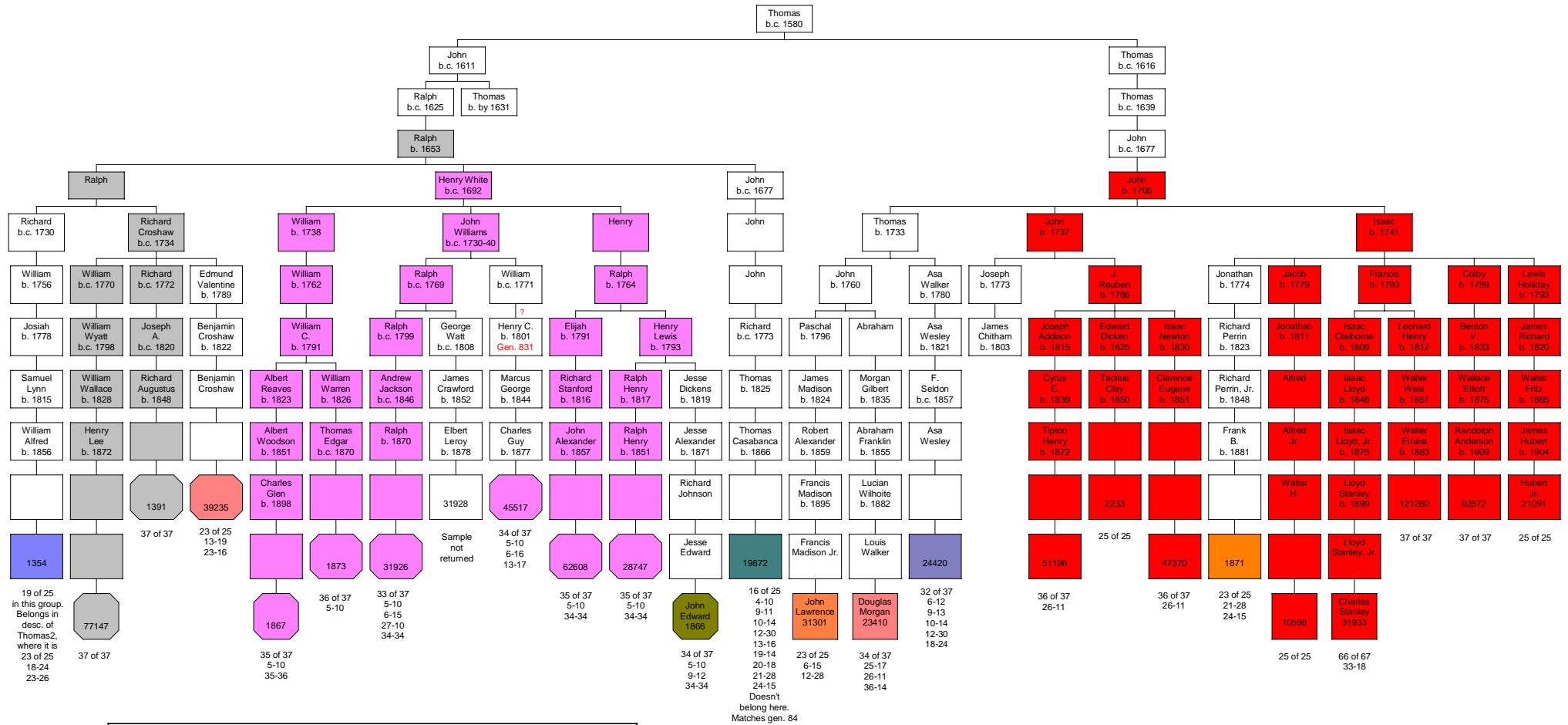


Descendants of Capt. Thomas Graves of VA (Gen. 169)

NOTES: This chart shows male lines of descent only. The number in each bottom colored box is the DNA test ID. 24 of 25 means that 24 of the 25 DNA markers matched the inferred ancestral haplotype. 13-19 indicates a mutation from the ancestral haplotype, and means marker 13 had a value of 19.

There are 2 ancestral haplotypes inferred on this chart. Based on DNA analysis, it appears that the descendants that have been traditionally attributed to Capt. Thomas Graves really consist of 4 different families, each descended from a different immigrant ancestor. The deviation from the ancestral haplotype for each of the 4 family groups is from the haplotype for that group. That means that the number of mutations shown on this chart may be fewer than the number shown in the master DNA results table.

Francis Graves, previously believed to be the youngest son, has been removed from this chart and put in genealogy 220, as discussed in the Capt. Thomas Graves genealogy. His descendants are a 25 of 25 match with the descendants of genealogies 166, 28, 247, and others. Also, John4 Graves, previously believed to descend from John2, Thomas3, has been removed from this chart and put in genealogy 270.

The haplotype of group 1 descended from John2, Ralph3 (hexagons) is a 25 of 25 match with genealogy 168. The red group 2 from Thomas2 has no known external match.

It can also be seen that some of the descendants shown on this chart are misplaced. These include: 1354 belongs in group 2 instead of group 1. 19872 doesn't seem to belong in group 1, but where it does belong is unknown. 24420 may not belong in group 2.
