

# Greaves Family of Beeley, Derbyshire, England (Gen. 228)

(Rev. 28 Sept. 2006)

NOTES: This chart shows male lines of descent only, since the focus is on using Y-DNA analysis to trace the Greaves surname.

The number in each bottom colored box is the DNA test ID.

When two descendants of a common ancestor have exactly the same DNA test results, it is assumed that the common ancestor also had that result, and all boxes up to and including the common ancestor have been given the same color.

All boxes with the same color have the same DNA test results.

24 of 25 means that 24 of the 25 markers matched the inferred ancestral haplotype.

A notation like 13-19 indicates a mutation from the ancestral haplotype, and means marker 13 had a value of 19.

The haplotype (set of DNA test result numbers) that is being used as the ancestral haplotype is the one in the bottom large blue area on the master DNA test results table, which includes genealogies 28, 166, 354, etc. With the small number of descendants of this family tested so far, it is difficult to be sure that this Greaves family is correctly placed. The number of mutations versus the ancestral haplotype is more than is usually considered acceptable for a match. Testing of descendants from more branches of this family is needed.
